At St Catherine's School, Stirling, we are proud of the Performing Arts program in our Curriculum.

Performing Arts encourages our children to expand their imagination and helps them develop their own, unique voice while developing cognitive skills. Each class is provided a weekly Performing Arts lesson as part of their curriculum.

Additional opportunities are provided to students, as listed below:

School Musical:

In Years 5 and 6 the students of St Catherine's partake in a school musical on a bi-annual schedule. This provides our students with an opportunity to experience both on-stage performances as well as set design, stage management and technical production. 2024 will be our next production year with performances in Term 4. Recent performances have included Into the Woods (2022), Matilda (2020) and Beauty and the Beast (2018)

School Choir:

Year 5 and 6 students are invited to participate in the senior school Festival choir. As part of being in the choir we partake in the annual Catholic Schools Music Festival. This is usually held in the final week of Term 3 (late September) at the Adelaide Festival Theatre.

Instrumental lessons:

Our students can choose to take private tuition instrumental lessons at school. We have highly qualified, specialist teachers in piano, violin, guitar and voice. These lessons are held during the day in our music rooms. Children are allocated a lesson on a specific day, some at an allocated time, some on a rotational basis depending on how the tutor works.
