#### **Ecology Update**

#### **YELP Composting Project**

Our Year 5 Youth Environmental Leaders Program (YELP) students have been hard at work researching a new composting system for our kitchen garden area. With the support of Jeremy Gramp from Green Adelaide, they have explored various composting methods to find the most effective and user-friendly solution to producing quality compost that we can use in all garden areas around the school.

A key focus of their research has been ensuring the system is easy to use while also preventing rodents. After careful consideration, the group has decided that a simple one-piece system is the best option.

#### **Butterfly Garden**

The Year 1/2 classes are continuing their work in re-establishing the Butterfly garden. As part of their planting for Easter, the children scattered seeds and planted 4 butterfly plants donated by John Leeton, Chair of the Parish Pastoral Council. We are very grateful to John for the support he has provided.

#### NAPLAN Conclusion

We are pleased to share that the NAPLAN testing process for our school has now been completed, with all students who were registered to participate completing all tests.

We couldn't be prouder of the way the Year 3 and 5 students approached each assessment. Their integrity, persistence and determination were evident as they gave their best effort.

We also want to extend our gratitude to the support provided by families. Your encouragement helped create a sense of security and confidence for the students, allowing them to navigate the testing process with ease.

We look forward to sharing the results with families when they are received later this year.

# Reading success with Literacy Pro

This year we are excited to continue our partnership with Scholastic and using Literacy Pro to help track students reading success. Students in Year 3-6 have completed placement tests in Scholastic's Literacy Pro, assessing their reading through multiple-

choice questions to generate a Lexile score. This helps them select suitable books from our school library, many of which are labeled with Lexile numbers.

Within Literacy Pro, students can choose themes of interest, receiving tailored book recommendations based on their Lexile score and texts that are available. They can also access the online platform at home to read digital texts or find books at the public library. After reading, students can take quizzes to track comprehension and build their 'words read' total—our school has already reached 11 114 656 words!


