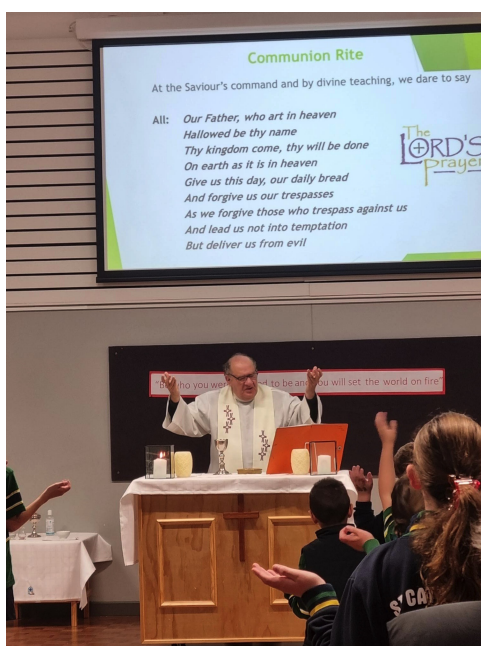

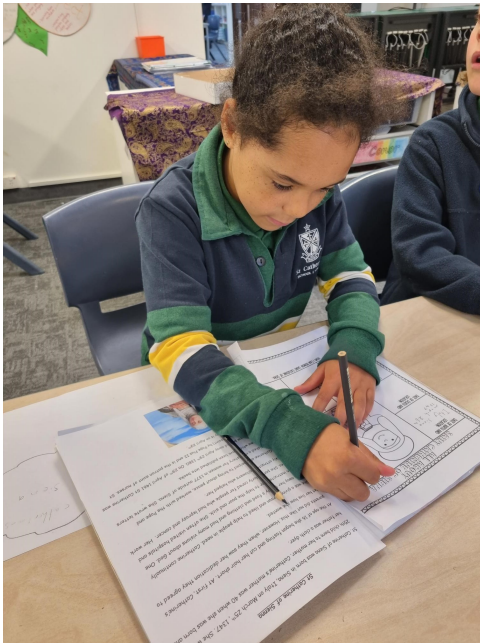


### Feast of St Catherine of Siena

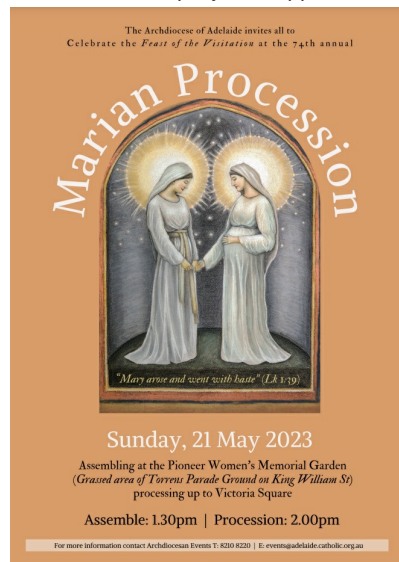

Walk Safely to School Day asks that we all consider our transport habits and try to incorporate more walking as part of a healthy and active way to get around. Although walking all the way to school isn't always realistic for many of us, it's quite easy to figure out how you can build a walk into your family's daily routine.

- You can commit to the healthy habit of walking more by
- Walking with your child the whole way to school
- If you use public transport, walk past your usual stop and get on at the next stop instead
- If you have to drive, park the car a few blocks away from the school and walk the rest of the way

Regular exercise like walking with your child, not only helps them beat chronic health problems like obesity and heart disease but has also been shown to improve mental health. It also gives you a great opportunity to teach your child safe ways to behave around roads and traffic and improve our environmental footprint.

On **Friday May 19th** staff from St Catherine's School will be walking to school from the **Stirling Library departing at 8.00am** to be able to return to school in time for a hot drink from the coffee stand. 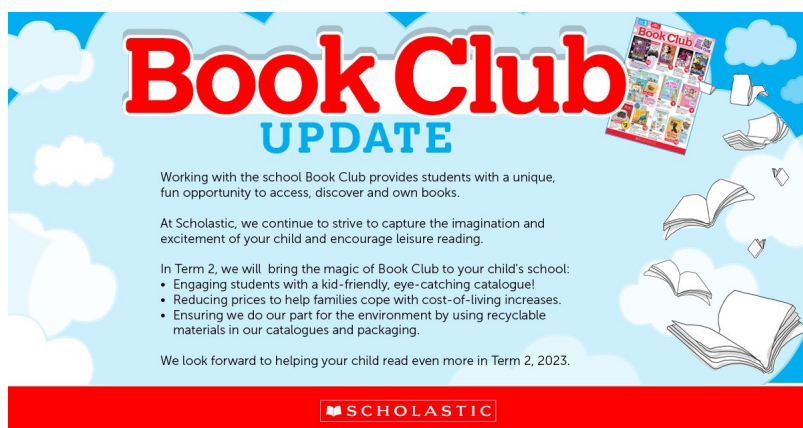
### Upcoming Learning Conversations

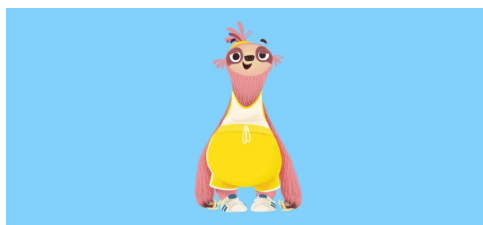


## National Simultaneous Storytime

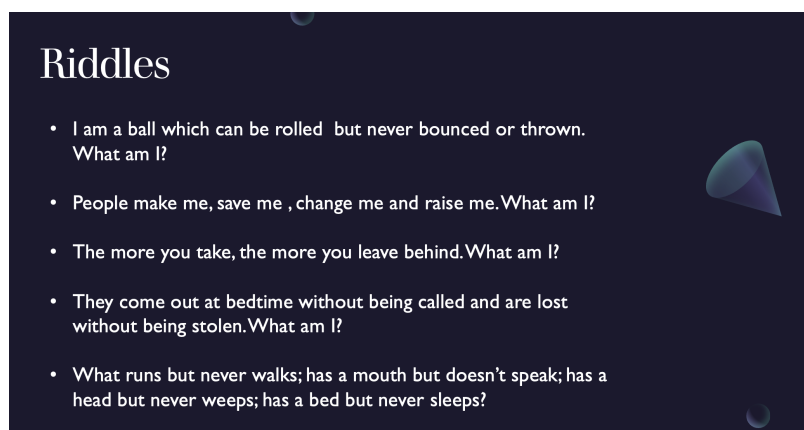
## Gifted Awareness Week (20th - 28th May, 2023)

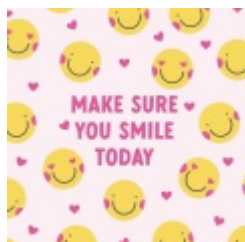
